### How to Foster Innovation?

**Step 1:** Look at things and life around you with curiosity. Become sensitive. Ask yourself why people are doing some things the way they are doing?

**Step 2:** While you acquire the process of observation without bias, you are likely to identify areas that can be improved. In other words, you think of solving some problems. OYO for example tries to solve the problem of reservation of rooms in budget hotels. MakeMyTrip tries to solve the problem of travel planning. Not just ecommerce, you can think of other areas also.

**Step 3:** See how your problem can be solved. You can solve many problems with available infrastructure. For example, a schoolboy in Mumbai observed that the Dabbawalas who deliver home cooked lunch boxes can

also double up as courier boys. He is now runs a huge business worth crores, while pursuing studies at school! The Dabbawalas have been around for several decades. But no one thought of using them for courier! Seems so simple.

This approach is called out-of-the-box thinking. It means applying your thinking by asking yourself, "Can this be done differently?" There are so many areas in our daily life which can be improved. You can take up one of them and apply your mind intensely.

Chances are the next big idea will bear your name! All the best.

### About Krishna Janmashtami

Krishna Janmashtami, also known as Janmashtami or Gokulashtami, is an annual Hindu festival that celebrates the birth of Krishna, the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu. It is observed according to the Hindu luni-solar calendar, on the Eighth day (Ashtami) of the Krishna Paksha (dark fortnight) in the month of Shraavana or Bhadrapada (depending on whether the calendar chooses the New Moon or Full Moon day as the last day of the month), which overlaps with August/September of the Gregorian calendar.

Tiny buds of PP1 and PP2 showcased a skit, right from the birth of Krishna to his Bal Leela. 'Kolu' was also arranged and Krishna Pooja was also done.

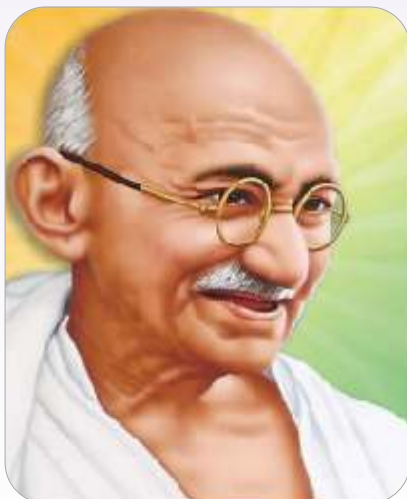
## Hindi Saptah



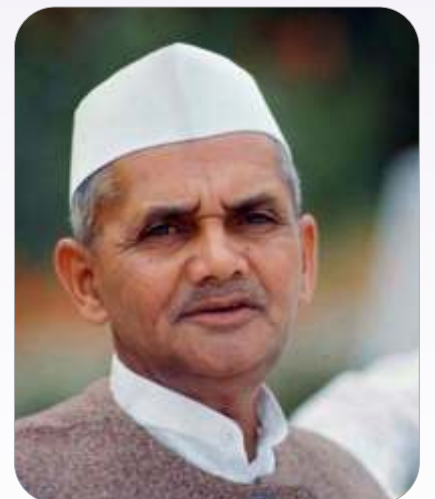

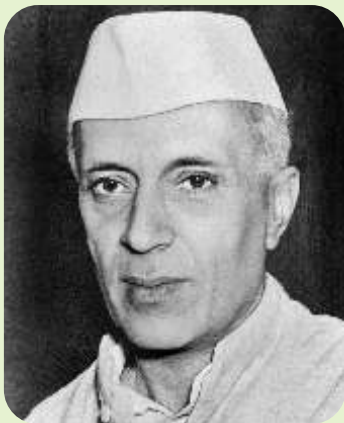
## Kannada Rajyotsava
