## History of Cricket

The sport of cricket has a known history beginning in the late 16<sup>th</sup> Century. Having originated in Southeast England, it became country's national sport in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century and has developed globally in 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> Century. International matches have been played since 1844 when Test cricket began. Retrospectively recognized in 1877, cricket was the world's second most popular spectator sport.

After "Association Football" governance is by the

"International Cricket Council (ICC)" which has over one hundred members although only ten play test cricket.

## History of Cricket in India

The entire history of cricket in India and the subcontinent as a whole is based on the existence and development of the British Raj via the East India Company. On 31<sup>st</sup> December 1600, Queen Elizabeth I granted a Royal Charter to the East India Company. It was initially a joint stock company that sought trading privileges in India and the East Indies, but the Royal Charter effectively gave it a 21 year monopoly on all trade in the region. The company transformed from a commercial trading venture to one which virtually ruled India as it acquired auxiliary government and military. Cricket is the most popular sport in India. It is played by many people throughout the country. The Indian national cricket team won the 1983 World Cup, the 2007 T20 Trophy, the 2011 World Cup, the 2013 Champions Trophy and shared the 2002 Champions Trophy. Ranji Trophy, Duleep Trophy, Vijay Hazare Trophy, Deodhar Trophy, Irani Trophy and NKP Salve Challenger Trophy. In addition, BCCI conducts Indian Premier League (IPL), a T20 competition.
